

# **Transforming Spaces FAQs**

# Do you redecorate flats or just bedrooms?

The programme only redecorates children's bedrooms and children's spaces in youth clubs, charities, or community centres. It does not redecorate sitting rooms or living spaces.

## Who can be referred to the programme?

Families living in poor conditions or struggling with overcrowding are great candidates for bedroom projects in the programme. Charities or community centres with youth programmes are eligible for community projects.

# What is the criteria for the bedrooms referred to the programme?

Bedrooms must be structurally sound and not have any signs of mould.

Bedrooms must require decoration (they should not have been recently painted).

Bedrooms are most likely to be accepted if one or more children do not have access to furniture in good condition such as:

- -a individual bed
- storage such as a wardrobe or chest of drawers
- a place to study (desk)

We may also be able to provide specialised furniture or room accessories to support children with additional needs.

If the only need is for furniture, please review appendix 1 at the bottom of this document for further information about furniture provision charities.

#### Who can make referrals to the programme?

Referrals can be made by legitimate charities (including religious groups such as churches), schools and local authorities. If you're an individual looking to refer yourself to the programme, please get in touch with a local charity that would be willing to refer you and act as your referral partner through the process.

#### How do I make a referral?

All referrals for the programme are made through online forms, which can be accessed on the Transforming Spaces web page. Please ensure that every question on the referral form is answered and no questions are left blank.

# Interested in making a referral to the Transforming Spaces programme?

- 1. Fill out an online referral form, which can be accessed through the Transforming Spaces web page. A member of the team will contact you once your form has been received and reviewed.
- 2. If the property seems suitable for the programme, we may ask that you send additional photos and videos of the spaces referred for redecoration.
- 3. Following this, we will contact you to organise a site visit at the property.
- 4. After the site visit, we will advise you if the property passes health and safety and will be accepted into the programme's caseload.
- 5. If the property is accepted, we will discuss possible dates and schedule the project. Please keep in mind that there is typically a waiting list for projects.
